Glick Foundation continue to support Jackson Public Schools and have established this funding source. Through their support, Jackson Public Schools is pleased to announce the 2020 Teacher Mini-Grant Program.

\$5,000 has been committed to awarding mini-grants to JPS secondary teachers by April 10, 2020. Materials will be ordered from April 13, 2020, through May 15, 2020. All receipts are to be submitted by May 15, 2020. Therefore, your grant application request can be used to support your classroom this school year, a summer initiative, or your classroom for the 2020/21 school year. Proposals should be unique, during or after-school projects or programs that support the mission and vision of Jackson Public Schools.

The maximum funding request is \$500. It is our hope that we will fund 10 mini-grants.

Applications must be filled out completely and will be reviewed on a first-come, first served basis. No further applications will be reviewed after Thursday, March 26, 2020 (4 PM). Once completed, please send to Dr. William Patterson at william.patterson@jpsk12.org. Again, staff will be notified of their award by April 10, 2020.

Evaluation Criteria: A review committee will be established to review all mini-grant applications. Specifically, the committee will evaluate each submission on the articulated need, potential impact on students, and its connection to the Mission and Vision of JPS. Please be sure to be clear and concise when addressing the questions on the mini-grant application.
